### Advocacy Scholars Program

- receive invitations to the Congressional Luncheon, NCSHPO Reception, and a Special Guided tour of the U.S. Capitol Building following the Preservation Action Congressional Reception.

### How to Apply:

The Advocacy Scholars Program is open to current graduate or PHD students or recent graduates (within one year) in Public Policy, Historic Preservation, History, Law, Planning, Architecture or related program.

**To apply, please answer the following four questions in 500 words or less.**

1. How will your attendance at Advocacy Week contribute to your academic work or goals?
2. Who in your community has advocated for historic preservation and inspired your interest in preservation leadership?
3. How do you see historic preservation advocacy changing in the next fifty years and how do you see yourself influencing those changes and new objectives?
4. In addition to increased funding for the Historic Preservation Fund and the Historic Tax Credit program, what other programs or initiatives should preservationists be promoting on Capitol Hill and why?

Your email submittal must include a one-page resume and proof of academic enrollment. Please also provide three state delegations you would like to accompany on Capitol Hill, if chosen to be a 2019 Advocacy Scholar.
