Co-chaired by Representatives **Mike Turner** (R-OH) & **Earl Blumenauer** (D-OR), the Historic Preservation Caucus serves as a forum for members to discuss ways to protect and revitalize America's historic places. The Historic Preservation Caucus is a great place for new and seasoned Representatives to work together to support preservation & economic development by advocating for sensible historic preservation legislation and funding. National preservation organizations work closely with the Caucus on initiatives throughout the year, including a Preservation Month briefing in May, organized by Preservation Action.

Through programs such as the Federal Historic Tax Credit, historic buildings serve as valuable economic development tools.
