





TRIBAL HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICERS

- With approved application, assume NHPA duties of SHPO
- Sovereignty & self-determination
- Funding from Historic Preservation Fund
- Wear many hats:
 - Inventories of Tribal cultural resources & places
 - Review federal projects
 - National Register of Historic Places
 - Revitalization of cultural traditions & languages
 - Repatriation & NAGPRA duties
 - Natural resources & ecosystem conservation
 - Tribal museums, cultural centers, oral history programs



HISTORIC PRESERVATION FUND APPROPRIATIONS FOR TRIBES




The number of THPOs increases each year. For the average apportionment per THPO to actually increase, the HPF Tribal appropriation must keep pace.

FY 2025

- \$34 million for THPO line of HPF
- 44% increase in FY23 brings it up to 11% of total HPF
- 221 THPOs (would avg \$154k each)
- Increasing reviews for infrastructure, energy, broadband
- Capacity to engage meaningfully
- Federal trust responsibility



AFRICAN AMERICAN CIVIL RIGHTS GRANTS

Ashton Villa in Galveston, Texas, is the first brick structure built by enslaved people in Texas. On June 19, 1865, U.S. Federal troops entered Galveston to enforce the immediate emancipation of slaves. Ashton Villa has hosted an annual prayer breakfast and celebration of Juneteenth since 1979. In 2023, the Galveston Historical Foundation, Inc. received an AACR grant for preservation work on Ashton Villa.



UNDERREPRESENTED COMMUNITIES GRANTS

Built in 1925–1926, the Village East
Theatre in New York City, formerly
known as the Yiddish Art Theatre,
received UCG funding to expand upon its
history as an LGBTQ cultural center and
safe haven in the post World War II and
AIDS epidemic eras.

PAUL BRUHN HISTORIC REVITALIZATION GRANTS

The Dillon Community Alliance in Dillon, South Carolina received a \$750,000 Paul Bruhn Historic Revitalization Grant in FY 2022 for the stabilization of commercial historic district buildings. This is the first Paul Bruhn grant issued in the state of South Carolina.



SAVE AMERICA'S TREASURES GRANTS

Noow Hít is the last surviving example of Lingít vernacular architecture in Haines, Alaska. It was dedicated August 11, 1962, to preserve knowledge of traditional construction techniques as part of the Alaska Indian Arts, Inc. carving program. The construction was guided by Lingít elders who had lived in traditional tribal houses in the late 1800s. In 2023, the Chilkoot Indian Association received a Save America's Treasures grant for the stabilization and rehabilitation of the Noow Hít tribal house.

FEDERAL HISTORIC TAX CREDIT (HTC)

- The Historic Tax Credit (HTC) encourages private investment in historic buildings
- The credit attracts private capital to revitalize often vacant and underutilized properties that have a financing gap between what banks will lend and what the project will cost
- The HTC is a 20% credit applied to qualified rehabilitation expenses for certified historic structures distributed over 5 years (4% per year)
- It represents, by far, the largest federal investment in historic preservation

IMPACT OF FEDERAL HTC 1977-2022

- Adaptive reuse of over **49,000 historic buildings**
- Total HTC Credits generated: \$44.3 billion
- Total federal tax revenue generated: \$50.3 billion
- Total HTC financed investment: \$235 billion
- Total direct and indirect/induced jobs: **Over 3.2 million**



CHALLENGES FACING HTC PROJECTS

- Prolonged financing challenges from federal policies/regulations, that have diminished the value of the credit, along with sky-rocketing costs of materials/labor and rising interest rates.
- Financing gaps within projects are increasing
- HTC has not been positively updated since 1986
- New federal credits recently modernized
- Recent National Park Service statistics show HTC Part 2 applications down 20% for FY2021– FY2023, when compared to FY2017 FY2019.



HISTORIC TAX CREDIT GROWTH & OPPORTUNITY ACT (HTC-GO)

H.R. 1785 – REP. LAHOOD (R-IL) & S. 639 – SEN. CARDIN (D-MD)

Temporary Provisions (House Bill Only)

- Temporarily increases the HTC from 20% to 30% to address recent unforeseen financing gaps in projects
 Permanent Provisions
- 30% credit for all small projects under \$2.5 million in QREs
- Lowers the substantial rehabilitation threshold
- Eliminates the Basis Adjustment, the requirement that the value of the HTC must be deducted from a building's basis (property's value for tax purposes).
- Makes the HTC easier to use by nonprofits

Tax Cut and Jobs Act and Community Development Provisions are Set to Expire in 2025

Purpose of the 2-Year Bipartisan Tax bill (\$79 Billion) being considered by Congress is to align provisions for 2025

Uncertain Political Dynamics – The Outcome of the 2024 elections will determine the breadth and scope of a tax bill in 2025

Certainty-Advocacy will determine whether the HTC has strong support and is worth of improving














LAND AREA COVERED BY LOCAL HISTORIC DISTRICTS




JOB GROWTH IN HISTORIC DISTRICTS

CHANGE IN JOBS, CUMBERLAND MD (2002–2017)






SHARE OF JOBS IN SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY HISTORIC DISTRICTS


AVERAGE VALUE PER SQUARE FOOT

CHANGE IN VALUE (2017 - 2022)


